NORTH VANCOUVER, April 25 – Canadian Bioenergy Corporation, the leading supplier of biodiesel in Western Canada, has announced that Barb Isman will be joining the company as Executive Vice President, Brand and Alliance Management. Isman is expected to begin her new role with Canadian Bioenergy in August 2007.

Canadian canola is an excellent feedstock for domestic biodiesel production, with a high oil content that offers superior fuel lubricity and cold weather operability.
